


Campus AED Locations


Safety comes **first** on Washington & Jefferson College's campus

An Automated External Defibrillator or AED is a device that is used to treat sudden cardiac arrest. They are lightweight, portable machines that automatically analyze a person's heart rhythm. AEDs can detect a problem that may respond to an electrical shock and will deliver a shock to restore a normal heart rhythm. Thanks to their small size and ease of use, AEDs have been installed throughout campus. The AEDs pictured on this map are the actual AEDs on campus.



How to use an AED

To use an AED, recognize that someone may be having a cardiac emergency. Get help on the way by calling Campus and Public Safety at (724) 223-6032, extension 6032, or dialing 911. Obtain an AED if one is nearby or direct someone to get one. Turn on the machine and follow the diagrams and audible directions. If you are trained, do CPR while someone else gets the AED and prepares it for use. If you do not know CPR you can help by pressing hard up and down repeatedly on the center of the person's chest. Once the AED is placed on the person as per the directions, follow the audible prompts and do not touch the person. Make sure help is on the way.
